About

The UTS Artist in Residence pairs one NSW-based visual artist or collective with a UTS faculty partner to support the creation of a new work.

The Artist in Residence program is a valuable opportunity for knowledge sharing and cross-disciplinary collaboration of mutual benefit to the artist and university research, and recognises the vital role of the arts in fostering the economic, social and cultural prosperity of our communities.

Support

The UTS Artist in Residence program is to be undertaken over 12 months, from February 2022 - February 2023.

A fee of \$10,000 will be paid to the Artist in Residence, with a further \$10,000 materials budget to support the creation of a new work. The materials budget will be administered by UTS Gallery & Art Collection.

The Artist in Residence will nominate one of the participating UTS faculties in which to undertake their research:

- Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences
- Faculty of Engineering and IT
- Faculty of Law
- Faculty of Design, Architecture and Building
- Faculty of Health
- UTS Business School

The Faculty Partner will assign a contact person to welcome the Artist in Residence to the faculty, and provide introductions to relevant academics, research areas and facilities.

The Artist in Residence will have access to UTS Library, UTS ProtoSpace, and in-kind support from their chosen School or Faculty as appropriate. The UTS Gallery & Art Collection team will provide curatorial, marketing and public program support.

The Artist in Residence is expected to have regular contact with the host Faculty and engage with Faculty activity as appropriate. Contact hours can be undertaken remotely.

A public outcome that suits the needs of the project will be developed with UTS Gallery & Art Collection staff.

Timeline

- Applications open 22 November 2021 and close 31 January 2022. UTS offices are closed between 24 December and 3 January.
- The successful applicant will be notified in February 2022
- The residency period is February 2022 - February 2023 with a public outcome to be determined in 2023

Selection criteria

Applicants will propose a research project to be undertaken during the residency term. Applications will be assessed against the following criteria:

- Track record of the successful applicant and timeliness of this opportunity for their career
- Project demonstrates meaningful engagement with UTS research in the nominated faculty
- Project will result in the creation of a new work
- Project is visible to and engages with the UTS community and the public. Engagement may include but is not limited to teaching and learning sessions, collaborative workshops, artist talks and public programs.
- Project is viable for the timeframe and budget allocated
- Project will result in a public outcome at UTS

How to apply

- In one PDF document with a maximum file size of 10MB, please supply:
 1. A one-page description of the proposed residency project. The applicant must identify and engage with a UTS Faculty prior to submitting their application. The project description should address how the applicant will engage with their nominated Faculty to support the creation of a new work.
 2. A basic budget outlining any anticipated material costs, access costs, equipment costs or other anticipated expenses.
 3. A two-page CV and/or bio noting recent exhibitions, projects and achievements
 4. Up to 10 examples of recent work, provided as digital images/video or links
